The Neighbourhood Plan survey closed on 5th January by which time about 1100 residents had provided us with a total of nearly 35,000 pieces of information on a range of questions covering your views and wishes on the future of our villages! This was a great

achievement for which we wish to express our deep appreciation to everyone that took the time and effort to participate.

It was also good to meet so many of you to hear your opinions on all aspects of village life at the St Peter's Church Fair, the Christmas Tree Lights Switch On, plus the various "drop in" sessions that we held. You may have also seen the various articles that appeared in the local press including the Leamington Courier, Stratford Herald and Observer, plus the District Advertiser and, of course, the Wellesbourne and Walton News, all of which helped to promote our campaign.

Whilst the majority of feedback was provided using the adult or the young people's on-line version of the survey, over 150 residents took the option to complete the paper version which will now be uploaded to allow the overall task of analysing the full data set to begin.

We would hope to have a preliminary view on the main findings and key messages from the survey during February and will share this information with you in next month's issue of the Wellesbourne and Walton News. In addition, we hope to make a presentation to residents of our work to date and plans for the future at the annual meeting of the Parish Council, which will be held in early March. Finally, once we have all the surveys available on-line, the winner for participating in the survey of a mini i-Pad, will be picked and the lucky person will be contacted to receive their prize!
