

Input to Wellesbourne & Walton News – March Edition



Analysis of the Big Survey is feedback now well underway!

The Neighbourhood Plan team have now embarked on the mammoth task of analysing all of the feedback provided in the 1087 responses that were received to the “Big Survey” Questionnaire which closed in early January. While it’s too early to be making statements about the key messages coming through, the team were pleased to have views from a wide cross section of our community which included 85 from young people below 16, and also from all parts of our villages, along with 56 from adjacent Parishes.

In addition to reviewing the feedback received to the responses made to the “tick box” questions, the team are now tackling the major task of analysing all of the written comments that were made, which exceeded 10,000! Only once this work is done will the team be in a position to share the overall views of residents on the key wishes and issues that will form the basis for developing the policies and proposals that will help to shape the future of our villages.

The intention is to make a presentation on the main messages extracted from the Big Survey as part of the Parish Annual Meeting which will take place on 10th March in the Village Hall. See the notices elsewhere in this Newsletter for more details on the event.



You may also recall that an incentive to complete the questionnaire was free entry to win an i-Pad mini. At the recent Parish Council meeting the prize draw took place and I’m delighted to say that Dick Kyrke, a resident from Wellesbourne, was the lucky winner and is shown here receiving his prize from John Hargis, the Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan team. Dick said he plans to donate the prize to the Wellesbourne Matters group in support of their campaign to prevent development on the airfield.
