### **Neighbourhood Plan at the Wellesbourne Street Fayre**

At the Wellesbourne Street Fayre on 7<sup>th</sup> June there will be a Neighbourhood Plan stand where you can meet members of the Steering Committee and tell us your views on the future of our village. This is the first major engagement session where you have the opportunity to do this!

We hope to speak with as many people as possible about what we are doing and to get ***your feedback*** on the issues that really matter to you.

Committee members will be delighted to answer your questions and will invite you to leave your comments. On the stand there will be plenty of prompts to get you thinking about what areas you might want to express an opinion on, such as housing, parking, traffic, green space, health & leisure. We also plan to have a large scale map to help you in making comments. This is your chance to tell us where you feel any developments should be focussed and also which locations you believe should be left alone. You can also take the opportunity to read what fellow villagers think as well.

There will also be a leaflet which describes what the Neighbourhood Plan is striving to achieve and why we all need such a plan. It will ask for your opinion on your likes, dislikes and wishes for our village. You can either fill in this leaflet on the day or send it to us later by post via the Parish Council offices. Alternatively you can make your views known by email or on our website.

We will collate all feedback and use this as input in the preparation of a questionnaire on the future of our village. This will go out to all homes, organisations, businesses and landowners later this year.
