Another challenge that the team has been tackling is to decide on the area for which the Neighbourhood Plan should cover. Typically this is the same as the Parish boundary but we have also been considering options to extend the area to include part of Charlecote Parish, around the HRI site. A resolution on this area will be known by late July following which a submission will be made to the Wellesbourne and Walton Parish Council and then sent to Stratford District Council to formally seek their approval to proceed with our Neighbourhood Plan.
